Fee:

\$100 per organization **per computer** for the Fall 2014 series (total of 13 sessions). Registered organizations or individuals may log on for any, or all, of the sessions at their discretion. The fee will remain the same; it will not be prorated based upon the number of sessions attended.

Support is provided for the fall 2014 series in part by the Kansas Health Foundation. Assistance is available to provide 50% (\$50.00) of the site registration fee for up to 30 local health departments registering for the Fall 2014 series. The local health department will be responsible for the remaining \$50.00. The stipend will be available on a first come, first served basis.

Continuing Education Credit/Certificates of Attendance:

The organization fee will include continuing education credit for nurses, social workers and a certificate of attendance for other individuals that are **employed by or volunteering at your organization and attending at your site**. A transcript will be issued at the conclusion of the series; certificates will not be issued for each individual session.

Please note: In order to continue to provide continuing educational activities for an economical fee, we are implementing the registration and evaluation forms online. If the participant has an electronic device (i.e. smart phone, tablet, etc.) they may follow along with the presentation and complete the forms at the time of the presentation or complete the forms when they have a computer available. Technology Test:
