### Key Questions:

- How do context or environment variables influence occupational performance and the occupational therapy process?
- How can different intervention approaches be used to address performance concerns?
- How does analyzing contextual and environmental features of a setting contribute to developing a needs assessment?

### Anticipated Outcome:

- the consideration of context and environment in intervention planning.
- a spectrum of intervention options.
- an understanding of service provision models as applied in a variety of service systems.
