The Research Institute has been delving into the records retention issue and upon finding no consensus, has begun the process of developing guidelines. Retention for general investigations and pediatric/child research is 7 years. Research involving pregnant women and fetuses could require record retention for up to 25 years. Issues are being addressed regarding storage costs and responsibilities.</p> <p>Professional Development: The Committee is working on events for Allied Health Week. Lou Loescher-Junge has arranged for guest speaker, Michael Hingson. He will be making a presentation in the SoN auditorium on November 2 from noon-1:00pm. The hospital is usually involved in this event; however, they are in the middle of O₂ training that week. They have indicated that they would be interested in holding a poster session at a later date. Lisa plans to attend the Student Senate meeting and make request for students to serve on various committees.</p> <p>APT: Reporting for Joan McDowd. 3-4 individuals going up for promotion and/or tenure this fall; two of them are clinical faculty.</p> <p>Faculty Practice: Reporting for Linda Griffith. <p>IV. Dean's Report</p>	<p>Dean Miller</p>	<p>Welcomed all Faculty back for the Fall semester! She noted that the SoN building has been in use for 10 years! She also mentioned several changes taking place around campus, including the new KUEA building on the south side of Rainbow and the Medical Office Building. The MOB is being designed to resemble the heart hospital. This will allow centralizing of all out-patient services and clinics. The building is to be completed by Summer 2011. A new patient parking garage is also under construction. One reason for all the additions is the daily patient census which averages 500; in years past, this number may have been as high as 300-350.</p>	

Renovations of Wahl Hall have produced a difficult situation with the evacuation of labs and offices currently housed in that area. Temporary housing must be identified for all these individuals. Dean Miller asked that faculty be patient with the temporary space issues.

Monies for these construction projects will be provided by a \$35M loan/bond issued by the Research Institute. All construction has either been funded by philanthropic donations or from bond monies – no State funds are involved. The KU Physicians group will lease space from the MOB.

Recently attended the new Provost's Retreat. Jeff Vitter is the new Provost and Executive Vice Chancellor who oversees the 14 schools of KU (3 on the KUMC campus). Being from an IT background, hopes to tackle the IT issues on the Lawrence campus. Each school currently has its own server with little coordination with the other schools.

The Retreat looked at higher education in general; discussing what post-high school/generally educated students need. Major changes in education delivery have already taken place on the East Coast. Much concern has been raised with the capabilities of college graduates.

Dr. Atkinson is working with the Hospital on a long-term strategic plan which connects with the Lawrence Campus' plan. Cancer is a major focus of the University along with neurological sciences; monies and energy to be focused on these specific areas.

On the national scene, Dean Miller is involved with groups addressing workforce issues. Concerns whether there will be enough docs/nurses to provide care for the large numbers of aging baby-boomers. Allied Health Research Institute (AHRI) is a group of Allied Health schools partnering with for-profit organizations to address specific needs in various areas of care.

The School of Public Health is moving closer to fruition; an accreditation site visit has been scheduled for the program which currently operates under the HP&M Department. The SoM is adding students to its new all distance-ed programs in Wichita and Salina. These sites also will teach some of the basic sciences.

FY11 budget appears to be okay. Of the State's budget, K-12 comprises 54% of the budget. It appears there will be no salary increases again this year.
