She used short podcasts and educational videos, occasionally stopping them during playback and sometimes listening to segments again, to define vocabulary and answer questions. This taught the students to find information they needed on their own, to develop inferencing skills, to learn new vocabulary through context clues, and to better comprehend new material. Nice job.
