

Join the LMH Health Hospitalist Group for an elective rotation in hospital medicine. This month-long program will provide you with familiarity of a community hospital care system, while gaining exposure to a broad array of pathology. You'll learn how physicians working with pharmacy, nursing, case management and social work can lead to better patient outcomes.

Additional goals of the program are:

- To introduce residents to coding documentation specialists and coders for quality, billing and reimbursement purposes, as well as quality improvement and medical staff governance processes.
- 2. To participate in providing quality patient care while being mentored by our expert medical staff in the hospitalist role.

As a part of the LMH Health Hospitalist Group elective rotation, you will gain quality clinical experience. Look at the experiences you will receive with this program:

I. Clinical care


- a. Direct patient care with panel to be co-managed with a hospitalist
- b. Daily rounding, admission, discharge of medical patients
- c. Co-management with surgery/peri-operative evaluations
- d. Observe operations of the hospitalist team and their impact on the quaity care provided
- e. Skilled Nursing Facility, Acute Rehab and open ICU care
- f. Management of patients requiring transfer to a higher level of care

II. Procedures (examples)

- a. Vascular access
- b. Paracentesis
- c. Thoracentesis

III. Healthcare systems

- a. Coding/documentation
- b. Billing and coding
- c. Patient safety/high reliability efforts
- d. Quality improvement
- e. Medical staff leadership
- f. Team approach and multidisciplinary care
- g. Transitions of care
- h. Palliative care



Our rotation in hospital medicine will give you the opportunity to be heavily involved in many areas, but also encourage you to enjoy your role, your team and the collegial relationships fostered at LMH Health. As a resident physician, you will be asked to meet a number of expectations.

- Resident physicians will round daily on patients during the business week. They will work one weekend and at least one swing shift. They will carry a patient load consistent with that of a practicing hospitalist and will co-manage patients with the attending rounding on those patients.
- 2. Day starts for on-site hospitalists at 7 a.m.
- Multidisciplinary rounds start at 9:30 a.m. in the ICU, 10 a.m. on 2 North and 10:30 a.m. on 3 West. Residents will be expected to present patients and lead rounds.
- 4. Documentation can be completed as appropriate and is to be co-signed by attending provider daily.
- 5. Residents will be expected to discuss admits with the emergency department, prepare discharge summaries and discuss patients with consultants.
- 6. Resident physicians will be encouraged to attend committee meetings with attending physicians.
- Resident physicians will be offered didactic and procedural education. Lectures will be presented in formal seminars. Informal education will be provided throughout the work day. Procedures may be supervised by either hospitalist providers or specialists.
