Safety Tips:

- 1. Always secure personal belongings and work areas (Theft is the #1 crime in any jurisdiction).**
 - Use lockers/lockable drawers and secure/lock labs and offices when unoccupied.
 - Keep items out of sight in vehicles or do not store valuables in vehicles.
 - Otherwise, ALWAYS keep essential/valuable belongings with you.
 - "Hot" Items for Theft: Money, coins, bags, backpacks, wallets, purses, computers, phones, electronics.
Note: Remember, if it is valuable to you, it is valuable to others
- 2. Situational Awareness– Be aware of your surroundings and limit distractions.**
 - Safety is a joint effort of the KU Medical Center Police Department and TUKHS/KUMC Community.
 - We ask our community to stay vigilant and practice good situational awareness.
 - Report suspicious activity or persons on campus to police.
- 3. Wash Hands and Clean Work Areas Frequently**
 - Maintain a social distance of at least 6-feet and use proper PPE if providing patient care.
 - Follow proper procedures for hand washing and PPE.
