KU ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS: You must be admitted to the Butler Community College ADN program for the semester in which you are applying for admission to the KU School of Nursing. **You must begin the ADN and BSN nursing programs during the same semester.**

Other KU requirements include a minimum cumulative GPA of at least 2.50, completion of all the prerequisite courses detailed below, three letters of reference, a professional resume, and the online application. Admission is competitive; applicants are not guaranteed admission.

When calculating GPA, all non-vocational and non-remedial courses from all colleges and universities attended are considered. Except for Intermediate Algebra, remedial courses are not factored into the GPA. When a course is repeated, both the original and the new grade are factored into the GPA. Except for A.D.N. courses, courses that do not transfer to KU are not factored into the GPA.

KU APPLICATION DEADLINE: Immediately upon notification of admission to the Butler Community College A.D.N. program, students should apply to the KU School of Nursing. All application materials, including transcripts and references, **MUST** be received by **July 1st**. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

LIBERAL ARTS REQUIREMENTS: Courses with grades of "D" or "F" will not be counted. No Pass/Fail courses will be accepted.
